Business people often believe that from Memorial Day to Labor Day, nothing happens. When we think nothing will happen, nothing will. The reality is exactly the opposite can happen for those who elect to be more aggressive in the summer months.

- Write a press release related to summer time activities and send it to appropriate newspapers both on-line and off-line.

- Focus on marketing and sales efforts. With summer "doldrums" coming up for many, look at ways to turn them to your advantage. Keep in mind that it doesn't matter what business you're in or what you sell. You might sell swimsuits and summer is your best time of year. These ideas hold true for whenever your particular slump might be.

Make special offers during this time. The apparel industry has done this forever. When fall is coming, out go the summer clothes and in come the winter ones. Ever think, "Why are the fall clothes coming in so soon?"

If you sell instructional information, offer a sale playing up the fact that summer is laid-back and this is the perfect time to sharpen your brain with a book, CD or course, while laying on the hammock outside?

Use words to describe the season and the sales in flyers or ads. How about "hot" prices on "sizzling" products guaranteed to "cool you off" when you see the value? Of course, winter months would require a "freeze" on prices, which are dropping faster than the temperatures outside.

So, when June comes around, start ramping up for the summer months to keep business steady and even on the increase.
