

TSBDC RECRUITING BASICS FOR SMALL BUSINESS

SBA 504 Refinance Announcement: The U.S. Small Business Administration recently announced that it will start accepting applications for its 504 refinance program, which allows businesses to raise finance against their real estate at low rates of interest. Originally introduced by the Small Business Jobs Act of 2010, the program had a short life, expiring in September 2012.

SBA is now authorized to approve \$7.5 billion under the revived 504 debt refinancing program in addition to \$7.5 billion for the regular 504 loan program. Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2016 on December 18, 2015, making the program

The 504 refinance program offers a high percentage of refinancing on the value of the real estate or capital equipment being put up. Small businesses can typically borrow up to 90% of what a property is worth, more than what is available on a normal commercial loan. Repayments are over a 20-year time period for real estate and 10 years for capital

Applications for a 504 loan are required to be made through a certified development company (CDC) that coordinates with lenders to provide financing. CDCs are nonprofit corporations that are regulated by the SBA. There are 270 CDCs across the country, each serving a separate geographic area.

Financing is made by a bank or other lender for 50% of the project, with the remaining 40% being funded under the fixedrate 504.
