## Jefferson Bass Returns... Without Mercy

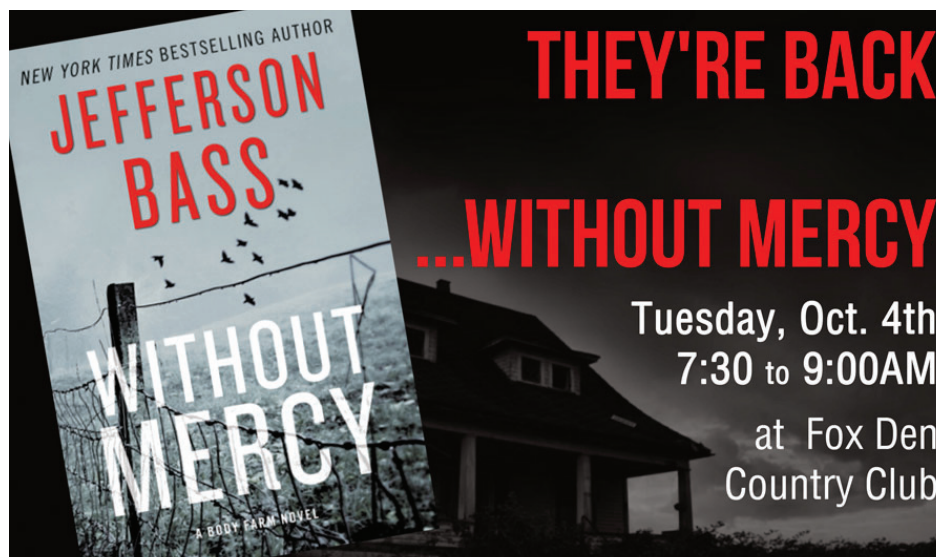
The Farragut West Knox Chamber Breakfast Speaker Series continues this October with a speaker duo set on sending chills down every spine in attendance! On Tuesday, Oct. 4 at 7:30 a.m. at Fox Den Country Club featured guests Dr. Bill Bass and Jon Jefferson (known as writing team Jefferson Bass) will premiere their newest novel, *Without Mercy*. Books will be available for sale and signing for the first time that day.

Newcomers to the "Body Farm" series may recognize Dr. Bass as retired forensic anthropologist, author and founder of University of Tennessee's Anthropology Facility known as the "Body Farm" (est. 1981). The two and a half acre "Farm" was the first facility of its kind in the nation. Bass's writing partner, Jon Jefferson—a veteran journalist, writer and documentary filmmaker—was producing a documentary on the "Body Farm" when he met

Bass. Bass asked for Jefferson's help in writing a non-fiction memoir (*Death's Acre*, 2003); the pair went on to pen ten novels and four non-fiction works.

*Without Mercy* is the tenth installment in the New York Times bestselling series featuring Dr. Bill Brockton, who is based on Bass himself. Brockton attempts to solve a bizarre murder and protect friends and family from a deadly old foe who has escaped from prison. Publisher HarperCollins describes the book as "the most suspenseful installment of the series to date" and a "harrowing, thoughtful, provocative tale" that juxtaposes "uneasy questions about justice and revenge, compassion and principle, the desire to kill and the will to survive."

### October Race Pre-Registration Open through 9/30

Whether they're runners, walkers or dog lovers all participants in the Chamber's 22nd Farragut Fall 5K, Fun Walk & Pet Parade will love the closed road course and other treats in store for them during the event! Runners will enjoy the scenery of Sedgefield Subdivision, and both runners and walkers can take in the peaceful paths of Mayor Bob Leonard Park.

Participants of all ages and skill levels can make plans to join the Chamber on Oct. 8 at Mayor Bob Leonard Park on Watt Road (closed from 7:30 a.m. until the last runner enters the park) for a fun fast-paced morning. 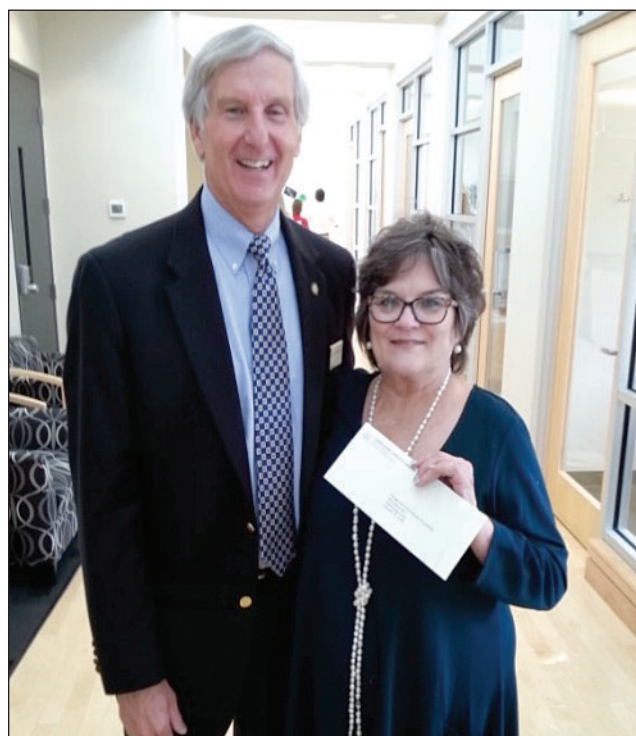

Pre-registration is just \$20 per person through Friday, Sept. 30. Participants 17 and under can register for only \$15! From Oct. 1 through race day, registrations increase to \$25 per person and \$20 for 17 and under.

The race and one-mile walk begin on Watt Road near Kingston Pike. Runners and walkers will travel up Watt Road with runners continuing north to enjoy a course through Sedgefield Subdivision. Walkers and pets head into the park where both groups will finish. Door prizes will be awarded while results are tallied, with \$50 cash awards for top overall male and female runners and age-group medals to follow.

A percentage of registration benefits local non-profit, Smoky Mountain Service Dogs (SMSD). SMSD trains dogs as highly skilled mobility assistance animals for area wounded veterans who have suffered limb loss or a traumatic brain injury and provides approved applicants with a dog and training at no cost to the veteran.

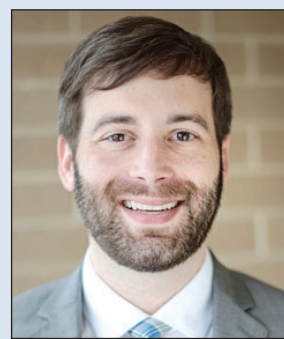
For those who wish to volunteer, help is needed at registration, on the 5k course (pointers, must be 18+), and cheering at the finish line. Service hours are
