Breakfast & Sports Tales

Hyams and Jarnigan Make Season Speculations

The familiar fight chant of, "Let's Go U-T!" filled an orange and white decked room while approximately 85 excited sports fans enjoyed breakfast and networking waiting for two empty chairs to be filled at the press-style table up front. They didn't have to wait long and, once the program started, the stories, stats, and laughter filled the air.

That was the scene the morning of Tuesday, July 30th at Rothchild Catering and Conference Center, where the Chamber continued its 2019 Breakfast Speaker Series with a fun program focused on the upcoming season for the Vols and the rest of the SEC, featuring speakers Jimmy Hyams and Jeff Jarnigan, two veteran sportscasters, each with a long history in the industry and plenty of tales to tell.

As resumes go, the duo brought a collective 55+ years of experience, with Jarnigan having spent over 25 seasons as PA announcer for the University of TN including, UT Football, Men's Basketball & The Pride of the Southland March-



ing Band, and Hyams breaking the top sports stories in Knoxville since 1985 after spending 16 years in Louisiana where he began his career. As things got started, Jarnigan good naturedly quipped that, "I didn't realize how old I was until you read my bio!"

Taking turns at first, then falling into an easy back-and-forth pattern, Jarnigan told stories of his time on and off the field and in the announcer's box, including one from his early years where he

Boyd Returns as Speaker in September

Entrepreneur. Animal lover. Philanthropist. Economic Development Commissioner. Marathon runner. Gubernatorial Candidate. All of these describe the speaker returning this fall to the Chamber's 2019 Breakfast Speaker Series, but with one more title: Interim President of the University of Tennessee. On September 17, the Chamber will welcome back Randy Boyd, the first in his family to graduate college and now in his role as University of Tennessee Interim President.

Boyd officially took office Nov. 22 following the retirement of UT President Joe DiPietro. As interim president, Boyd serves as the chief executive officer of a statewide university system that includes the flagship campus in Knoxville, campuses in Chattanooga and Martin, the Health Science Center in Memphis, the Space Institute in Tullahoma, and statewide institutes of agriculture and public service.

Though he currently only intends to serve a maximum of 1-2 years for the university until they find a permanent replacement, he has been quoted as being "excited", "energized", and "exhilarated" to serve, refusing to take a salary for the work (Boyd does receive a healthcare stipend).

Members of the Chamber and public last enjoyed hearing Boyd speak in 2017 about his time under Governor Bill Haslam as Haslam's Commissioner of Economic Development. Before that, he spoke in

2012about his experience starting Radio Systems PetSafe, a company he founded and grew from a small trailer office to over 800 employees in six countries.

He also serves as chairman of Boyd Sports and is the owner of the Tennessee Smokies, Johnson City Cardinals, Greeneville Reds and Elizabethton Twins.

Boyd also served as Gov. Bill Haslam's adviser for higher education and was the architect for Tennessee Promise, Drive to 55 and of Tennessee Achieves—initiatives aimed at increasing the number Tennesseans with post-secondary degrees to 55 percent by 2025 and decreasing financial hardship for those Tennesseans pursuing de-

Even with all these accomplishments, the echoing feedback from past events with Boyd through

Just like last year, October 13, 2019 will see a fun festival in Farragut full of handmade crafts, craft brews AND-new this yearlocal barbecue, all under a new name and with new coordinators!

The Chamber is excited to partner with members Shangri-La Therapeutic Academy of Riding (STAR) and John Volpe, general manager of Abuelo's: The Flavor of Mexico and founder of the Southern Taco & Tequila Festival (now in its 5th year) to continue the event concept started by the Chamber in 2018 with a goal of offering something new and different in the Farragut area for families, craft beer aficionados and anyone who loves a great fall festival.

The new concept will be a ticketed event open to the general public; all passes include admission to the festival, a donation to the event's beneficiaries, STAR and the Chamber (a non-profit and not-for-profit, respectively), plus the opportunity to shop lo-



cal artisan's wares and enjoy live music from Noon to 6 pm on Sunday, October 13 at the Sitel parking area across from Cotton Eyed Joe's on Outlet Drive.

General admission passes will be sold online and at the gate for \$25, and include one brew ticket (standard 10 oz pour) and two "Q" tickets. Q-Only passes are available for \$15. Kids 10 and under are free. Additional Q or brew tickets can be bought on-site for \$5.

Artisans are encouraged to apply for the juried event. Craft vendor spaces are 10' x 10' with a \$25 application fee. If accepted, there is NO further booth fee. Artisans are returning from the Chamber's Crafts & Ale and are excited to be participating. Crafters will all be under a large main tent, but will need to supply tables and any display framework.

Hyams, who is the current host of SportsTalk on Sports Radio WNML, kicked off his portion ticking off his predictions and stats for Vols football, basketball (men's and women's) as well as delving into NFL territory at the request of some fans.

Hyams predicted that the Vols will go 7 and 5 this season but will really hit their stride in season 3 of Coach Jeremy Pruitt's program with a more experienced offensive and defensive line; he also had high expectations of Jim Chaney's second season as Tennessee's offensive coordinator. When asked about quarterback Jarrett Guarantano's

FUELing Your Career

Each month this section will feature a piece written by a member business aimed at working professionals or recent graduates seeking tips and tools on how to FUEL their growing career, whatever the industry. Preparing for a Job Interview

Interviewing for a job can be an experience filled with fear and anxiety. The best tactic for fighting worry is preparation. As a professor of communication at King University in Knoxville, I mentor many students in workplace readi-

ness. I share three preparation tips: company research, answer preparation, and nonverbal communication.

The first step in interview preparation is becoming familiar with the company. Learning about the organization's history, mission, and vision for future impact will allow you to tailor your answers by connecting the organization's current identity with you as a candidate. For example, when asked about why you might be a good fit for the job, you can highlight relevant work experience, share strengths, and identify specific ways you will support the company's mission if hired. In other words, researching the organization is a key first step that communicates interest in the position, a willingness to go above and beyond what is required, and a connection to the company.

Second, interview readiness means preparing thoughtful answers to commonly asked questions. Search common interview questions online to discover helpful lists of conventional questions. The lists I find most useful are from sources that explain the thought behind each prompt. For instance, in an article about answering common interview questions, the Muse Editor describes why an interviewer is asking a particular question and provides tips for successfully addressing that topic.

The final preparation step is nonverbal communication. Job candidates must carefully consider attire and confidence cues. Select clothes that convey professionalism and a thoughtful level of formality. If flummoxed about what to wear, seek input from trusted people who dress professionally themselves. Professional attire communicates capability, but so do other nonverbal behaviors. Dr. Cuddy, a Harvard Business professor, researches "power posing" and identified wrapping oneself up or dropping one's shoulders as "low power" postures. Alternatively, good eve contact and open posture communicate confidence. Practice confident nonverbal cues before and during the
