## After hiatus, THE AUCTION returns

After a double fiscal-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Chamber and event committee are excited to bring back their single largest annual fundraising event, "THE AUCTION."

President/CEO Julie Blaylock commented on the event's long pause: "Our last actual auction was held in Spring 2019 for the 2018/19 fiscal year. By March 2020, though we'd been planning the event for that April, it clearly couldn't happen. We tried to imagine a way to hold it in the Fall 2020 but our full focus really needed to be on our businesses and how we could support them. We chose to wait. As winter went on with changing recommendations from the CDC and others, we didn't feel a spring 2021 event was even feasible. So, we pushed it into Fall 2021, which meant two full operating years without this essential event."

Blaylock is grateful that 2020 Presenting Sponsor, TDS Telecom, opted to keep their commitment and let it carryover to 2021. "TDS was very gracious and understanding; they're an amazing partner, as they have been all the 34 years we've existed as a Chamber," she says. Staff also came up with a new stand-



ing logo that will carry on year after year.

The 33rd AUCTION will take place on Thursday, September 16 at 6pm at member The Venue at Lenoir City and will be catered by Rothchild Catering. The event committee, co-chaired by Terry Smiley-First-Bank and Stacy Madar-Pinnacle Financial Partners, is excited about the visual theme, "Evening Under the Stars." Blaylock admits the theme was originated because, "Back in January we were betting on holding this event outdoors; however with a better outlook with COVID and the vast space of The Venue, we're moving it back indoors." Attendees will enjoy an evening of rustic glamour, with warm woodsy décor, "star" lights, lanterns and multiple sumptuous food stations in keeping with the theme. Guests can EVEN wear their "around the campfire" best, including jeans, if they wish!

THE AUCTION sees an average 250 attendees and represents upwards of 300 member businesses via

sponsorships, silent & live item donations, table purchases and individual guests. This annual event is integral to making sure the Chamber can keep providing the maximum quality and quantity of programs and services to business members and the communities where they work and live.

# BUSINESS FACTS with Max

## How do I TALK to Gen Z?

For those who don't know, Generation Z are those individuals who are currently age 11-26 (born 1995-2010) and sandwiched between Millennials and Generation Alpha. As we enter the workforce, it feels like our communication style is constantly in question by potential employers. Are the rumors true? Are we all these antisocial children unable to function outside of our screens?

The answer: no. It may come as a surprise, but Gen Z works best with face to face communication. If I just flipped your whole perception of Gen Z upside down, don't worry, because I am going to help you communicate more effectively with us. Here are 3 Tips to talk with Gen Z:

**1: Touch base with us frequently and on multiple platforms.** Saying we work best with face to face communication does not mean to throw out emails and instant messaging. Instead use a multi-platform approach. Gen Z currently has the HIGHEST digital literacy of any generation. We learn and navigate new software very quickly. This fast-paced navigation allows us to effectively use emails and instant messaging to ours and our employer's advantage, as long as you are using them, too. However, on top of digital communication, we still need face to face to truly understand the tone of what you are communicating (unless you want to start using emojis in memos to indicate your tone).

**2: Be honest & candid.** Gen Z is forthright and prizes authenticity. We have grown up in a world where privacy is fleeting, and that has shaped how we interact with others. Don't try to soften a blow by glossing over bad news or critical feedback. We value frankness and it helps build more trust between Gen Z and our older generational counterparts.

**3: Give input and feedback freely.** Feedback not only shows that you value our ideas but it also emphasizes that there's a level of respect between us and that you value us. Gen Z's biggest fear in the workforce is being treated like children and being undermined because of our age. We value autonomy, but also like to check-in often to ensure we are on the correct path of a project or assignment; your feedback is the perfect way to help us gauge that and self-correct.
