

Breakfast Speaker concerned for attendees' lives

Approximately 50 attendees logged onto the chamber's first 2021 Breakfast Speaker series webinar the morning of February 2 and were greeted with a somber opening. Speaker, Dr. Garland Vance, wasted no time in telling attendees, "I'm here because I am concerned for your lives."

Focusing on lessons from his Forbes recommended book, "Gettin' (un)Busy: 5 Steps to Kill Busyness and Live with Purpose, Productivity, and Peace," coach and consultant, Dr. Garland Vance explained the premise of his book, and moved onto quickly helping attendees understand that TOO many commitments are bad for our health-even when all of those commitments are technically "Good."

How does one know they are TOO busy? The signs are obvious, Vance says. Exhaustion, stress, headaches, distraction and depression are just a few of the mental and physical symptoms that can start to show when even the best and most productive people allow themselves to become too busy. Vance should know. He started having chronic migraine headaches, heart palpitations and exhaustion while working on his own doctorate, working for a nonprofit and raising three kids. His own doctor explained that his health was in jeopardy because of his busyness. Vance said that working parents can be particularly susceptible; the average parent spends seven hours actively parenting their children on top of a fulltime job. A Gallup poll cited for his book states that most fulltime workers average 47 hours per week,

2021 Breakfast Series continues

The chamber's 2021 Breakfast Speaker Series, which kicked off officially on February 2, already has another edition lined up, this one especially for sports fans who'd like an audience with local media legend Jimmy Hyams.

An online ZOOM webinar format is planned for the February 18 program at 8:30am, "Heupel at the Helm." The webinar will spotlight Hyams, who among many things is a 4-time Tennessee Sports Writer of the Year, former Heisman voter, and currently the acting Sports Director for Cumulus Knoxville. Known for his vast knowledge of not just the University of Tennessee's athletics programs, but also owning a deep bank of statistics on SEC coaches, players, and their histories, Hyams never fails to give his honest opinion of where a program is or where it is likely going (with a tendency to be on the mark).

With the recent announcement of changes for the University of Tennessee's athletic director and head football coach coming just days apart, this is a fantastic opportunity for fans to hear Hyams' straightforward thoughts on new football coach Josh Huepel, new Athletic Director Danny White, and what it means

for the future of those programs.

While up to the first 30 minutes will let Hyams give an overview of recent happenings in both UTK and other SEC sports, a



with almost 40% logging over 50 hours weekly. Also, the number of people who "always feel rushed" has increased by 50% over a 30 year period—and appears to be climbing still.

So how DOES someone (un)busy? Vance covered his five D's of the process in broad but clear strokes. (1) Decide if your busyness is worth it or if the negative effects are outweighing the positive. (2) Deconstruct the beliefs that are keeping you so busy (i.e. many high functioning individuals and leaders think that stress equates to incompetence, when really our bodies and minds are trying to sound a very real warning) AND begin deconstructing your current commitments. (3) Design the life and schedule you want to have, and make time for things like rest, family and recreation a priority in your new schedule. (4) Develop an (un)busy calendar by using tools to help you set more buffers and boundaries, plus develop ways to de-stress that truly work for you. And (5) Draw others in by inviting family and friends to live better, less busy lives. Likewise, if you lead a team at work, set the example for staff and colleagues.

Vance wrapped up by answering attendee questions, such as how junior staff can operate in a work environment where being overly busy is valued and expected. Vance described a tactic he used early in his career where he asked management to let him experiment with his own schedule, promising that if he could not deliver the same results of management's 55 hour week within 40 hours, he would return to management's heavier schedule (spoiler: he delivered more in less time). He also advised another attendee struggling with "caring too much for her staff" that self-care and boundaries would allow her to show up better when her staff really needed her ear for non-work issues.


Hill Group Inc – January 14, 2021
